Finally, I would like to especially thank Jeff Ploeger for the added work he did in calling each of the "finalists" and screening them prior to the last round of interviews. His contribution and professionalism definitely enhanced the selection process.

Your Board and Management Team has been working especially hard on spending control and managing to budget. Despite our moderately successful membership campaign, we are still well short our budgeted membership levels and as a result, are facing an especially difficult task. The good news is we have built up fairly substantial capital and cash reserve accounts so we are not at risk in the short term. However, there will need to be significant changes to sustain the quality and level of service we have all come to expect from OUR CLUB, unless we can recruit new members. You have already probably noticed changes in cart fees, both private and course owned, an increase in the service charge for food and beverage and a small increase in beverage cart charges. Other changes, if and when approved, will be implemented as painlessly as possible but, I'm sorry to say, cannot be avoided.

The Board has asked the Legacy and Future Visions Committees for new ideas for fund raising, structural changes to our operations and/or "projects" that can improve our sustainability position. Please stand by for notices on these in future newsletters or mailings. The ideas that have surfaced thus far are quite encouraging.

That's it for now. As always, please let me know if you have any questions or comments. This is YOUR CLUB. Enjoy it. Support it. Let us know what we can do to make it better.

The first half of April we had warm and dry weather conditions, the second half has been wet and cold. We have received 3.50 inches of rainfall since the middle of April. Needless to say, we accomplished quite a bit. The irrigation system is up and pressurized. We still have a few holes to check to make sure that the sprinklers are operating smoothly. The greens were double verticut and sand topdressed on April 4th, this helped smooth the greens out some. We have lowered the height of cut a little; once we get warmer and drier conditions we will lower the height of cut on the greens a little more. The preemergent herbicide control for crabgrass as well as broadleaf weed control was applied to all fairways as well as the primary roughs. We treated just over 70 acres of turfgrass. The tee box on #17 was core aerified then rolled, trying to remove the crown in center of tee box this process will be repeated in a few more weeks. Most of the bare areas in the fairways and roughs have been seeded. We have a few bare areas in the roughs that have yet to be seeded. The shrub and mulch areas have been treated with a preemergent weed control. We added new mulch to the mulch areas throughout the golf course. The mulch in all mulch areas around the clubhouse is still in very good condition and was only raked and turned. The past three weeks we have been mowing greens, tees, fairways and roughs as well as raking the bunker as the weather has allowed. With the month of May around the corner and hopefully warmer weather we will begin a more routine maintenance schedule to all areas of the golf course. Along with normal golf course maintenance we will be working on various cultural practices such as apply the preemergent controls for crabgrass to the tees, spot spray broadleaf weeds in the roughs; and most importantly the Spring aerification schedule is as follows.

Monday, May 16th solid tine aerify fairways.

Monday, May 16th aerification to the tee boxes.

Monday, May 23rd needletine, double verticut and sand topdress the greens.

"Meeting Called for To-Night to Form a Club"

Headline

The Burlington Hawk-Eye

April 14, 1899

"On June 7, 1899, articles of incorporation were filed thus making thus the first incorporated Golf Club west of the Mississippi. An organizational meeting was held and the following officers were elected: President, Charles C. Clark, Captain of the Green; H.W. Chittenden, Secretary; Jack Garrett and treasurer, H.W. Perkins. The officers were ex-officio members of the Board of Directors, the other elected members being Mabel G. Millard. Ruth C. Sherfey and E. W. Danner. The membership was set at 200"

1981 Reminiscences

October 12, 1917*

"Motion made and carried that dues per year March 1st, 1932 to March 1st, 1933 as follows:

Active reduced from \$45.00 to \$25.00

Associate reduced from \$25.00 to \$15.00

Children reduced from \$10.00 to \$5.00

Student active over 21 reduced from \$25.50 to \$15.50

Student associate 18 to 21 reduced from \$15.50 to \$10.50

Nonresident reduced to \$6.00

Privilege given to pay dues in monthly installments if desired.

Motion carried that price of meals be changed temporarily from March 1st, 1932 as follows:

Regular 75 cent meal reduced to 50 cents

Ladies Club luncheon reduced from 50 cents to 40 cents"

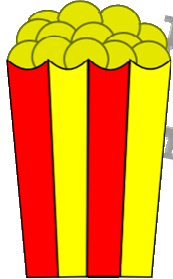

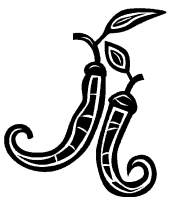

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Adult Males are required to wear shirts with a collar. Dress mocks are acceptable. It is the member's responsibility to make sure their guest's are dressed in proper attire.
2. Golfers may start on #10 if approved by the golf shop. Groups coming off of #9 green have the right away.
3. All members need a bag tag. If you do not have one, please stop in for your free bag tag.
4. Tee Times are required on weekends and holidays!
5. Sign-In! To ensure smooth operation here at BGC, please sign-in before you head onto the golf course. Many times members have gone to the first tee to find someone in front of them that had not registered in the golf shop.
6. Please be aware what nine holes the Men's and Ladies leagues will be playing if you wish to play during the week. On those league nights, one nine is reserved for those that play league.
